LOTT Receives National Environmental Achievement Award

Last night the LOTT Clean Water Alliance was awarded a 2025 National Environmental Achievement Award from the National Association of Clean Water Agencies. The award recognizes outstanding contributions to environmental protection and the clean water community. In the "Watershed Collaboration" category, LOTT's designation was for its Clean Water Community Connections program. The program is designed to play an active role in broader community efforts that support water quality, including the development of additional affordable housing, collaborative planning for sea level rise, creating joint educational and recreational amenities, partnering with school districts and more.

Matt Kennelly, LOTT's executive director, commented, "I'm honored to accept this award on behalf of the dedicated staff at the LOTT Clean Water Alliance. We are committed to meeting our community's growing wastewater treatment needs and designing supportive programs that benefit overall water quality for decades to come."
